

Town hall focuses on lawsuits, legal options for residents impacted by Flint water crisis

FLINT, Mich. --The Flint water contamination lawsuit and the legal options available were debated inside a local church Sunday.

There are a lot of people eligible for this lawsuit—nearly 100,000 people.

However, only 15 percent of that figure have signed up so far.

Sunday's town hall was an effort to spread the word and let residents have their questions answered.

Members of the panel included Reverend Doctor Herbert Miller, Councilman Eric Mays, and attorneys from the New York-based personal injury law firm Napoli Shkolnik PLLC handling the case.

Actor Hill Harper served as the event's moderator and says he feels a real connection to the people of Flint.
